

### **PolioPlus Donations**

Rotary began the fight to end polio in 1979. In 1985, about 350,000 people were affected with polio each year. Since 1988, there has been a worldwide reduction in polio cases of 99.9%.

For more than two years, we've seen wild polio cases in only two countries, Afghanistan and Pakistan. This year, there were 12 reported in Afghanistan and 50 in Pakistan.

Rotary has helped to inoculate over 2.5 billion children around the world.
