2. Number and scope of projects completed, and number impacted by results. Projects may be submitted for judging in only one area: International, Community, School, Fund-Raising, Activity with Rotary, or Inter – Club Projects.
 - A. Project scope – documentation defining all work required to complete a project including its goals, tasks, budget, resources, and measurable outcomes or products received.
 - B. Projects will be judged in the Table of Contents area under which it is submitted. Other areas will not be considered for evaluation even though the project may overlap other areas of emphasis.
3. The number of new projects and continuing projects will be considered in the scoring. More points will be given for project diversity and new projects. Continuing recurring projects of your club is important, but Rotary International also encourages clubs to continually evaluate the needs of their community and diversify.
4. Projects completed in all areas including International, Community, School, Fund Raising, Activity with Rotary, Fellowship, or Inter-Club will score more points. Emphasis may be in one area but Clubs are encouraged to participate in all project areas. Some areas are a great way to partner with your Sponsoring Rotary Club.
5. The percentage of members participating in projects as well as total hours contributed to the project will be considered in judging.
6. Include records and documentation of projects. This is a breakdown of the project scope.

 - C. Members involved
 - D. Total project hours
 - E. Impact of project
7. Number of New members is also factored in the score. The fact that it is school and the populations fluidity is noted.
